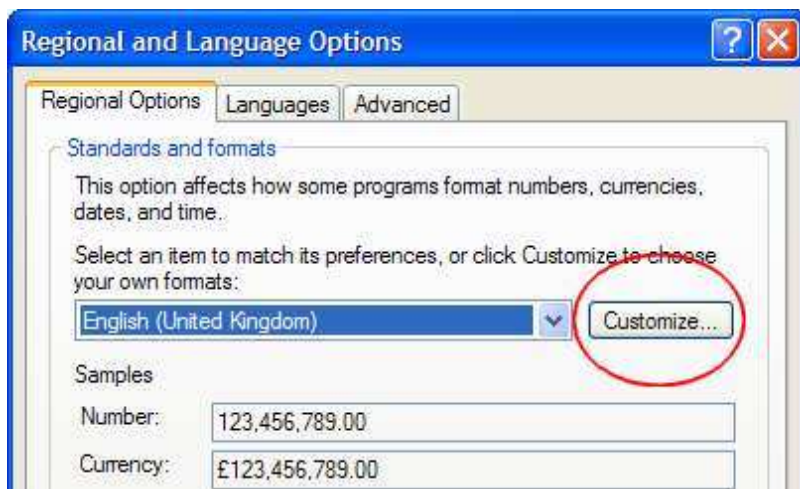


# Setting your local currency symbol

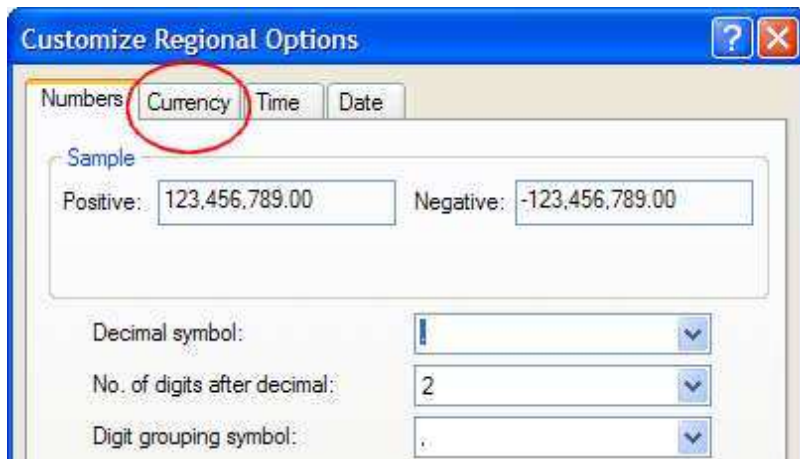
The currency symbol used in B2 Applications is not coded into the program. When the application runs, it looks at the settings within the Windows Operating System and extracts the symbol from there. If you see a symbol which is not your local currency, it means your computer has not been 'localised' since the time you bought it. Localising your computer will then enable the application to display your proper currency symbol.

## INSTRUCTIONS:

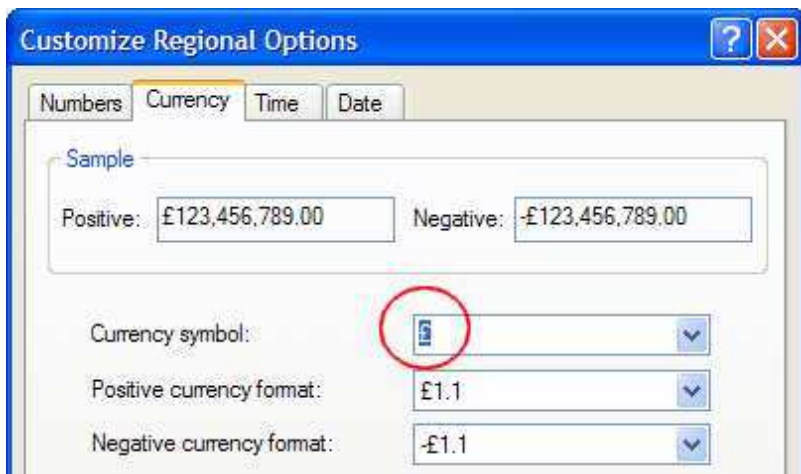
1. From the Windows Start Menu, open the Control Panel.
2. Open Regional and Language Options.
3. Select your location from the drop-down list. If your location is not on the list, you need to click the Customize button and do steps 4-6, otherwise go to step 7.



4. Next click on the Currency tab at the top:



5. Edit the currency Symbol to change it to your local symbol:



6. Click OK at the bottom.

7. Click OK again on the original screen.

The application should now display your currency symbols correctly. If the application was running while you made the above changes, you will need to close and then re-start it to see the change. You might also find that other financial software will now display your currency properly aswell.
